

# Regents name Atkin President

Lee College Board of Regents on June 18 named Jacob Atkin as the college's 11th president, marking a new chapter of leadership focused on growth, innovation, and student success. Atkin assumes the role effective immediately.

Atkin has served as interim president since Feb. 26, 2026, providing steady leadership during a pivotal time for the institution.
